Stylesheet for submissions

to Forum for Contemporary Issues in Language and Literature Journal

- 1) Papers are invited in English, Polish, Spanish, Catalan, or German.
- 2) Submitted text should include: name and surname, institution, ORCID, abstract (100-150 words), 5-7 key words.
- 3) Papers should not exceed the limit of 6000 words.
- 4) Font: Times New Roman, size 12, single-spaced, justification throughout.
- 5) For quotes of more than 3 lines leave a single line break between the top line of the quote and main text as well as between the bottom line of the quote and main text.
- 6) In-text citations: (Gaard 1993,1), (Lukszyn and Zmarzer 2006, 78–80).
- 7) Footnotes are not to be used for bibliography. Their purpose is to offer additional information, comment, explanation, etc. (the text is single-spaced, Times New Roman 10).
- 8) The following quotation marks should be used for quotes and quoted concepts: "..."; in order to emphasise quotes within quotes, please use the corresponding single quotation marks: '...'.
- 9) Omissions are indicated by three dots in square brackets: [...].
- 10) Provide URLs for the references, where available.
